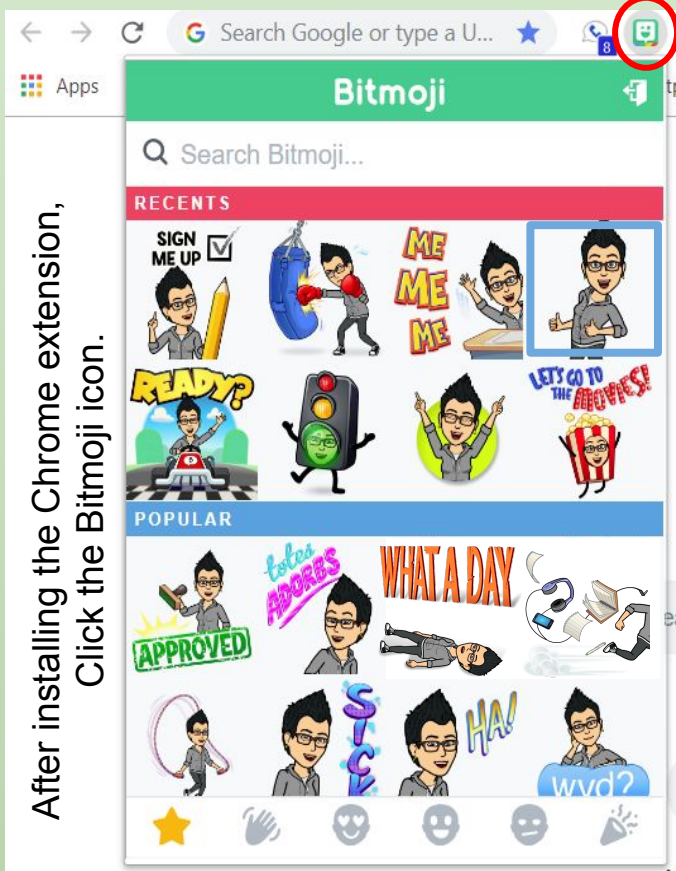


# Creating Friendmojis Using

A [Chrome extension](#) allows you to add your [Bitmoji](#) by quickly dragging & dropping it in to docs, slides or email or copying/pasting into a document.



After installing the Chrome extension, Click the Bitmoji icon.

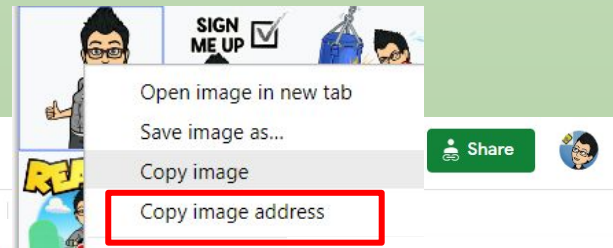

Instructions:

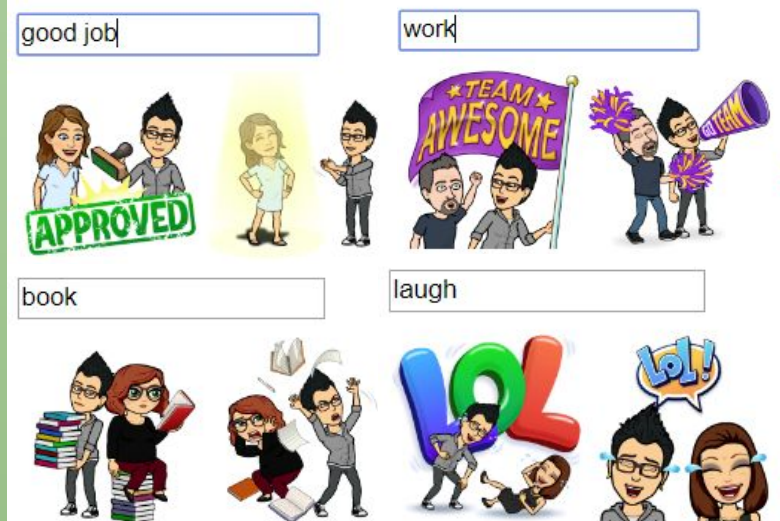
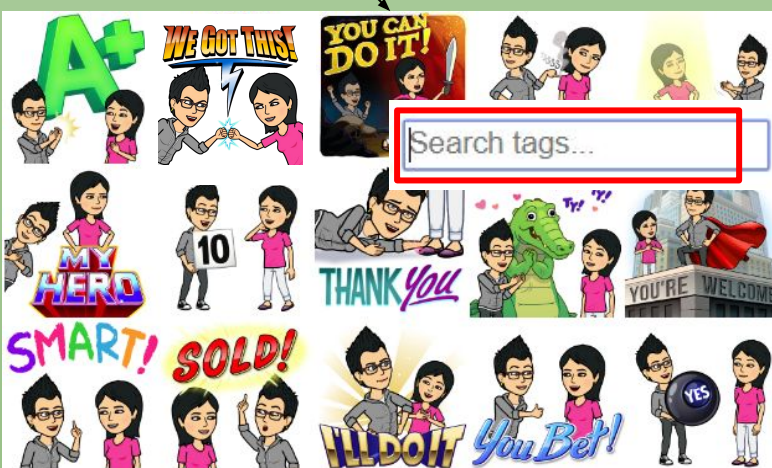
- From your Bitmoji Chrome Extension, copy the image URL from any Bitmoji
- Paste that in the Friend 1 column (Column C)
- Ask a friend for the image URL for their Bitmoji
- Paste that into the Friend 2 column (Column D)
- Voila - Column A should update with a link to all of your Friendmojis
- Oh, and you can enter the names of the friends into Column B so we can all see who is who :)
